Christie Administration Announces Holland Township to Receive \$270,320 Through Schools Development Authority's Regular Operating District Grant Program

Furthering the Governor's commitment to providing the state's children with safe, modern and efficient schools, the Christie Administration today announced that the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) has executed a state grant to the Holland Township School District through the SDA's Regular Operating District (ROD) grant program.

The details for the district grant are as follows:

Project:

Holland Township School: Upgrade entrance for handicapped access; Masonry and exterior upgrades; Upgrades to improve drainage; Replace existing slate roof; New hot water heater system at kitchen; New water softener system for two building domestic water services; Repairs to cupola/bell tower; New security system.

State share: \$270,320

Local share: \$405,480

Estimated total project cost: \$675,800

SDA Chief Executive Officer Marc Larkins, in cooperation with the Department of Education, announced the resumption of the grant program in May 2010. Since then, the SDA has executed 388 grants. The state-grant program funds at least 40 percent of eligible costs for projects in the RODs, addressing health and safety issues, student overcrowding and other critical needs.

The Department of Education selects school projects to receive grant funding from the SDA. The State has provided more than \$126 million in grants to local districts since the May 2010 announcement, leveraging projects estimated at a total of more than \$274 million. Funding for the program was made available through the sale of \$500 million in bonds by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA).
