Christie Administration Announces Plumsted to Receive \$281,600 Through Schools Development Authority's Regular Operating District Grant Program

Furthering the Governor's commitment to providing the state's children with safe, modern and efficient schools, the Christie Administration today announced that the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) has executed five state grants to the Plumsted Township School District through the SDA's Regular Operating District (ROD) grant program.

The details for the district grants are as follows:

Projects:

New Egypt High School: 1) Upgrade of essential security systems; 2) Upgrades to auditorium and electrical service.

New Egypt Primary School: Upgrade of essential security systems

New Egypt Elementary School: Upgrade of essential security systems

New Egypt Middle School: Upgrade of essential security systems

State share: \$281,600 Local share: \$225,340

Estimated total project cost: \$506,940

SDA Chief Executive Officer Marc Larkins, in cooperation with the Department of Education, announced the resumption of the grant program in May 2010. Since then, the SDA has executed 810 grants. The state-grant program funds at least 40 percent of eligible costs for projects in the RODs, addressing health and safety issues, student overcrowding and other critical needs.

The Department of Education selects school projects to receive grant funding from the SDA. The State has provided over \$245.5 million in grants to local districts since the May 2010 announcement, leveraging projects estimated at a total of \$573.4 million. Funding for the program was made available through the sale of \$500 million in bonds by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA).
