Maintaining Our Schools Through the SDA Emergent Project Program

The SDA's Emergent Project Program allows for the repair and rehabilitation of SDA District facilities when approved by the New Jersey Department of Education due to potential health and safety issues. Emergent projects are underway in districts statewide including Paterson, Irvington, Bridgeton and Vineland.

The Impact of ROD Grants Throughout the State

The ROD grant program impacts students around the state by providing at least 40 percent of eligible costs for projects addressing health and safety issues, student overcrowding and other critical needs.
