TRENTON CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL TAKING SHAPE

Construction of the new Trenton Central High School is moving quickly with structural steel installation now complete and building enclosure underway.

On October 27, 2017, SDA joined state and local officials, Trenton School District leaders, and students for a ceremonial “beam signing” to highlight the progress of construction on the new high school. Those present signed a piece of steel that will later be hoisted into place as part of the new facility.



2017 SCHOOL OPENINGS

SDA continues to improve educational facilities for thousands of students statewide through the construction of new schools, additions and building renovations. In 2017, SDA opened five new or renovated schools, providing more than 3,100 additional seats for students throughout New Jersey and impacting nearly 4,200 students overall.

The five completed school projects represent a state investment of more than \$230 million. The schools delivered by SDA include Quarter Mile Lane Elementary School in Bridgeton, Halloran Elementary School in Elizabeth, Gloucester City Middle School, Patricia M. Noonan Elementary School in Jersey City, and the Harry L. Bain Elementary School in West New York.

SDA ACCEPTS GOOD NEIGHBOR AWARD FOR PHILLIPSBURG HIGH SCHOOL

On July 14, 2017, the New Jersey Business & Industry Association (NJBIA) presented SDA with a “Good Neighbor Award” for the Phillipsburg High School project.

Phillipsburg High School was one of 14 projects recognized by NJBIA for “improving New Jersey’s economy and landscape.” The awards recognized visionary architects, builders and financing professionals who turned exciting ideas into reality.

Managing Director Thomas Schrum and Program Officer Aruna Reddy accepted the award on behalf of the SDA.

The new 330,000 square-foot Phillipsburg High School is designed to accommodate approximately 2,170 students in grades nine through twelve. The school was designed by DIG Architects, constructed by EPIC Management. Heery International served as construction manager.

**SDA ISSUES ADVERTISEMENT FOR LARGEST
CONSTRUCTION PROJECT IN PROGRAM HISTORY**

In June, the SDA issued an advertisement for construction of the Dayton Avenue Educational Campus in Passaic City. The project scope includes a four-story, approximately 448,000 square foot educational campus, to educate 2,760 students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through eight. The construction cost estimate for the Dayton Avenue Educational Campus design-build contract is \$170-\$180 million, making it the largest construction project undertaken by the SDA to date.

An award recommendation was approved at the SDA's November 15, 2017, Board Meeting.
