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Christie Administration Announces Emergent Repairs to Begin at Camden School

TRENTON – Furthering Governor Christie's commitment to ensuring that students attend modern and efficient schools, the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) has approved the start of construction for an emergent repair project at Harry C. Sharp Elementary School in Camden.

A \$196,146 general construction contract was awarded to D.A. Nolt, Inc. of Berlin, NJ to perform a roof replacement at the school, which educates students in grades Pre-kindergarten through Sixth. This emergent project is funded and managed by the SDA. Work is anticipated to begin at the end of June and will take place during the summer break.

Emergent projects are those deemed necessary in SDA Districts due to health and safety issues. The schools were inspected by the SDA and the Department of Education (DOE), which authorized the repairs.

The SDA designs, constructs and fully funds new and renovated schools in SDA Districts. Emergent repair projects are either managed by the SDA or delegated to SDA Districts.

The SDA's ongoing portfolio includes six new construction projects and more than 50 active emergent projects in SDA Districts. SDA's portfolio also includes one addition/renovation project and hundreds of executed grant projects in Regular Operating Districts.
