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New Jersey Schools Development Authority Announces Emergent Repairs Recently Completed at Trenton Central High School

TRENTON – As part of Governor Christie's commitment to ensuring that students attend modern and efficient schools, the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) recently completed an emergent repair project at Trenton Central High School.

A \$59,713 general construction contract was awarded to Wallace Brothers, Inc. of Point Pleasant, NJ to perform repairs to the main entrance pediments of the school, which currently educates more than 1,700 students in grades ninth through twelfth. Work began at the end of June and was completed at the end of July.

This project, which follows a roof repair to the Trenton Central High School valued at \$177,114, was for repairs over the auditorium of the school that were completed in January 2010. The roofing project was awarded to Grafas Painting Construction Company, Inc. of Millburn, NJ.

Emergent projects are those deemed necessary in SDA Districts due to health and safety issues. The schools were inspected by the SDA and the New Jersey Department of Education (DOE), which authorized the repairs.

The SDA designs, constructs and fully funds new and renovated schools in SDA Districts. Emergent repair projects are either managed by the SDA or delegated to SDA Districts. Both of the completed emergent projects at Trenton Central High School were managed by the SDA.

The SDAs ongoing portfolio includes 3 additional new schools currently in construction, the advancement of 10 Major Capital Projects and more than 50 SDA-managed and district-delegated emergent projects. Additionally, the ongoing portfolio includes hundreds of grant projects in Regular Operating Districts.
